- You can incorporate ideas of your own or use some of those listed below.

Ideas to help you stay safe:

- 1. Try to walk with a group of friends.
- 2. Keep to busy areas.
- 3. Never talk to strangers.
- 4. Don't wear head phones as you won't hear trouble approaching.
- 5. Always make sure someone knows where you are.
- 6. When alone have your mobile phone on vibrate so it won't draw attention to you if it goes off.
- 7. Don't carry valuables or large sums of money.
- 8. If you think you are being followed go to the nearest house or shop for help don't go to someone's home unless you know them.
- 9. Plan ahead and make sure you know where you are going and how to get there. Don't wander around and look as if you are lost.
- Have an emergency number in your phone or carry change for a pay phone.
- 11. If you are attacked shout 'fire' rather than 'help' as it usually attracts more attention.
- 12. Be careful of people asking for the time or directions or for money keep a safe distance.
